LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear SAAPRI family,

The South Asian American community is one of the fastest-growing ethnic groups in Chicago and across the state and country. As we approach the end of 2023, I am proud to release SAAPRI's initial analyses of 2020 U.S. Census Data; and with it, I would like to share a few reflections.

SAAPRI continues to focus on building solidarity with the broader community while advocating on behalf of South Asian Americans.

This year has been pivotal in our growth, and we have worked tirelessly throughout the year to make strides in advancing the organization's mission.

Whether by addressing healthcare disparities, documenting bias motivated discrimination and hate crimes, or employing multifaceted approaches to defend voting rights, we have remained committed to bringing about positive change via our Health Equity, Access to Justice, and Democracy projects respectively. None of these would have been possible without the continued generosity of our supporters, donors, funders, and partners who have collectively helped strengthen our financial stability and position us for growth. In 2023, we welcomed three new staff members to create and maintain important internal systems to support our finances, programming, operations, communications and development.

I am delighted to introduce to you Murtaza Ali (Finance Manager), Maya Bhowmik (Programs and Operations Associate) and Francys Munoz (Communications and Development Associate). Please join me in extending a warm welcome to these new team members who are already contributing to our ongoing and future initiatives. I am also pleased to welcome three talented research fellows to our team: Aakash Ray, Litcy Kurisinkal and Prottusha Sarkar. This dynamic, talented, and driven group brings a wide range of unique skills and experiences that will help advance our goals by ensuring our communities have voice and visibility through data-driven advocacy.

While we have reached some noteworthy milestones this year, I would also like to highlight a project you have significantly contributed to on various levels over the past four years. As South Asian Americans are not a homogeneous group, a <u>precise count</u> of our community members is essential in order to gauge the true impact of our growing presence. In 2020, SAAPRI collaborated with our elected officials, community leaders, and partners to ensure a <u>comprehensive count during the decennial census</u> followed by advocating with the U.S. Census Bureau and the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) for disaggregated data to enable a full understanding of the increasingly diverse populace. In September 2023, the U.S. Census Bureau released new data on nearly 1,500 race and ethnicity groups.

Building upon the groundbreaking 2005 and 2013 demographic reports titled Making Data Count, today I am excited to share the updated <u>demographic profile of South Asian Americans in Illinois</u>. This is our first release from our ongoing analysis of data sourced from the 2020 United States Census.

Without nuanced reporting such as this, our communities are often overlooked by policy makers, resulting in our critical emerging and longstanding needs remaining unmet. As we continue to expand our analysis, I hope this report not only provides you with insightful information about our communities but also underscores the meaningful impact your continued support for SAAPRI makes.

I would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to the <u>SAAPRI team</u>, the SAAPRI Board, our funders, donors, and the rest of the SAAPRI family as we move forward into 2024 and beyond. Together, you have helped the organization carry out its mission by fostering independent research, maintaining community partnerships, and developing policy recommendations to address issues that are most meaningful to our communities. 

HEALTH EQUITY PROJECT

SAAPRI continued its dedication to advancing health equity in 2023, serving as a crucial Regional Community Based Partner in the Asian Engagement and Recruitment Core (ARC) under the Asian Health Coalition. ARC's mission, as part of the National Institute of Health's All of Us research program, is to involve diverse Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander populations in research, accelerating healthcare advancements. Our outreach and educational activities supported the program's goal of gathering medical data from one million individuals in the U.S. to enhance precision medicine, particularly addressing the lack of disaggregated health data for South Asian Americans, one of the fastest-growing ethnic groups.

In addition to our partnership with ARC, SAAPRI hosted impactful events throughout the year, addressing health disparities and expanding internal capacities for collaborative research. Events focused on community health, social determinants of health, diabetes, mental health, and breast cancer awareness. The Breast Cancer Awareness series featured engaging virtual panel discussions, involving survivors, providers, researchers, legislators, and advocates.


Our partnership with Friends of the Forest Preserve at Bunker Hill highlighted mental health in the September Chai Shai & Yoga event. Collaborating with the Chinese American Service League (CASL) for the second year, we conducted a survey identifying social determinants of health affecting South Asians within the broader AAPI community.

DEMOCRACY PROJECT


In 2023, SAAPRI continued its impactful Democracy Project, acknowledging the substantial role South Asian Americans play in sustaining democracy. Through initiatives like Census work, redistricting advocacy, and non-partisan voting rights awareness, SAAPRI aimed to elevate the civic engagement of the underrepresented South Asian American community in Illinois.

The project focused on three pillars: advocacy, education, and engagement. Notable events included the Aap Ki Kahani Open Mic at Chiya Chai in Logan Square, featuring special guests like State Rep. Kevin Olickal and Sonny Patel. Executive Director Shobhana Verma's advocacy for improved language access for immigrants in Illinois was highlighted in a July 21st WBEZ report. SAAPRI actively engaged in community events like Oakton Community College's Asian Night Market and participated in the 10th Annual Asian American Action Day in Springfield.

Additionally, the team played a crucial role during the 2023 Chicago Municipal Elections by promoting voter turnout and advocating for language minority voting rights as required by Section 203 of the Voting Rights Act to ensure limited english proficient voters aren't excluded from participating in the electoral process. The 2023 Municipal Election turnout, while one of the highest in two decades, underscores the ongoing commitment of SAAPRI to protect the rights of the diverse South Asian American electorate.


ACCESS TO JUSTICE INITIATIVE



Since its founding in 2001, SAAPRI has been deeply involved in combating hate crimes, and we continue this work as a central part of our organization's mission to advance policy in response to the South Asian American and broader community's needs. Our past work includes developing and helping pass anti-hate resolutions in the Illinois House and Chicago City Council as well as successfully advocating to the FBI to track hate crimes against our communities. **SAAPRI's Access to Justice Project** is conducting local and statewide research to prevent hate crimes and discrimination by strengthening interfaith coalitions and passing anti-hate resolutions in Illinois as well as helping advance racial equity through Asian American history education in IL public schools mandated by the TEAACH Act.



SAAPRI Oral History Project: "Our Immigrant Story: South Asians in Illinois, 1945-1965"

TEAACH ACT ADVOCACY PROJECT



In an effort to promote South Asian American history, this year SAAPRI received Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) approval to run Professional Development workshops for Illinois teachers. This is a great step forward for us to be able to hold workshops to guide educators who have never studied South Asian American history before. South Asian Americans also share a history with other marginalized groups, and SAAPRI's Oral History Project will exemplify the similarities and differences between these groups in order to create a curriculum that builds solidarity. This is crucial in order for students to live in a diverse society.

While there is currently no funding for South Asian Americans to create their own curriculum, SAAPRI believes culturally responsive pedagogy is a model in which students bring in their culture into the curriculum. Their cultural identity is not hidden; instead, students are motivated to connect to the content by upholding their identity. In order for teachers to practice cultural competence, they need resources provided by experts. Unfortunately, some educators assume that students know their own history, but this is an assumption.

Although the student body is forever changing, the TEAACH Act only recently passed, and SAAPRI wants to prepare educators to teach in a socially just and equitable manner. Research indicates that more students attend school and get higher grades if they see themselves in the curriculum. In a way, SAAPRI's oral history project can be therapeutic for students who have been invisible or dealing with silent trauma for so long.

We see a dire need in creating curriculum around South Asian American historical context, intergenerational comprehension, religions, holidays, festivals, immigration, discoveries, the film industry, political figures, return migration, and contributions to American society. SAAPRI remains committed to making a conscious effort to enhance representation through curriculum thus giving voice to a group that has been ignored, silenced, invisible, and stereotyped in history.
